Dear parents and carers,



This week, we took part in the NSPCC Speak Out, Stay Safe programme. This nationally recognised initiative helps children learn, in an age-appropriate way, how to stay safe from harm and what to do if they ever feel worried or unsafe. The children learnt: they have the right to feel safe; there are trusted adults who will listen and help and it's always okay to speak out about worries—big or small. As part of the programme, I carried out an assembly focusing on "Who can I talk to?" The children listed the many trusted adults they can turn to—both in school and at home—whenever they need to talk or tell someone about their worries. Today each class shared what they have been learning in their PSHE lessons.

Hedgehog class told us they had learnt about Buddy the Speech Bubble who helps children to speak out. If anyone is unkind or hurts them, they should speak to a trusted adult when they are at school or at home. Rabbit class talked about if they are worried or sad they should also speak to a trusted adult wherever they are. Fox class had discussed that all children have the right to be kept safe and talked about how to get help if they don't feel safe. They talked about the 5 ways that children can be hurt by others. They then completed a small activity writing down four or five adults at home or in school who they trust to speak out to if they feel unsafe.

that children in our area will have an increased awareness of Phyllis Tuckwell and the role we serve in the local community.
