



Puttenham Church of England Infant School Accessibility Plan 2024-2027

At Puttenham School we are committed through our school vision and values to ensuring equality of education and opportunity for all irrespective of disability. We aim to follow and implement the requirement of the Equality Act 2010, SEN and Disability Act 2001, Disability and Discrimination Act 1995 (DDA) and SEN Code of practice 2014 to provide equal access for education.

The government document 'The Equality Act 2010 and schools' (May 2014) refers to the definition of disability from The Act as 'when a person has a physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and long term adverse effect on that person's ability to carry out normal day to day activities.'

This plan sets out the proposals of the governing body to ensure that all pupils have equal access to education by

- Increasing the extent to which disabled pupils can participate in the school curriculum.
- Improving the environment of the school to increase the extent to which disabled pupils can take advantage of education and associated services.
- Improving the delivery of information to pupils, parents and carers who are disabled.

The accessibility plan has been drawn up in consultation with our school Local Committee members, staff, children and families of the school.

At Puttenham School we aim to provide an accessible environment, as is reasonably possible, which values and includes all pupils, staff, parents and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, emotional and cultural needs. We are further committed to challenging attitudes about disability and accessibility and to developing a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion.

Respect, hope, resilience, wisdom and love are at the heart of our Christian School values.
