CHILDREN'S LEARNING

This term children will build on and develop the skills, which they have acquired throughout their learning so far throughout our topic for this term: 'Transport – on the move'. We will explore different themes within the history of transport and learn about key historical figures such as Amelia Earhart, and the Wright Brothers.

TIMETABLE

Our PE lessons are continuing to be timetabled for Wednesdays and Fridays so they will need to come into school dressed in their PE kits on **Wednesday** and **Fridays**. Please ensure that all kit is named including trainers.

Book changing days will continue to be on Monday, Wednesdays and Thursdays (please remember to send books in otherwise we cannot exchange them.) As we get to the end of the phonics scheme, there will no longer be a read write in book bag book sent home or allocated online; instead they will receive an additional reading for pleasure chapter book.

Things to keep at school

We try to plan for our lessons to make the most of the outdoor areas where we can and therefore it is very important for your child to have a spare **waterproof coat** in school **every day**, which can stay on your child's peg. This is essential for playtimes too.

HOMEWORK

Again, the most important homework is **reading every day**. Please do keep hearing your child read and note this

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in the reading record diary; including how they have read. It is also important to have meaningful discussions about what they have read to ensure understanding. Encourage them to re-tell the story to you, discuss characters and new vocabulary and express their opinion on the books they have read. Please also make sure to discuss any unfamiliar vocabulary so that they can infer the text and understand what is being read. It is wonderful to see the children's confidence in reading developing, as well as their fluency.

We will continue to have a show and tell session on a Thursday afternoon – due to so many children taking part in this last term, we ask that children bring in things which are purposeful and that they have prepared to talk about, so that the class can stay engaged and all children get a chance to present.
