The main differences between

We continue to build on the knowledge and skills acquired in Reception and Year one however...

Lesson sessions become longer

Year 1 and Year 2

- Greater expectations of the children's listening skills and work ethic with a focus on presentation and stretching themselves
- Encouragement of greater independence and using initiative.

General Routines





- Coats in school everyday please. Waterproof coat on peg please.
- They put their bags in their book bag boxes.
- Morning routine to promote independence children to put book bags in their trays and begin their morning starter.
- In class children get out their morning work books for the morning starter, some will have 1:1 catch up work, complete marking targets or small group work with a TA.

Literacy

Listening to and developing a love of reading through a variety of poetry, fiction and non-fiction texts. Using these to inspire the planning of writing stories, instructional writing, recounts and poems linked to our GFL topic and Christmas.

Phonics and spellings through the Read Write Inc. programme recapping set three sounds. Supporting our writing by revisiting and learning new punctuation and grammar. Continued gross and fine motor development to support handwriting.

Frequent opportunities to develop our speaking and listening skills by respecting each other by giving them time to listen and having a go ourselves.

Numeracy

Recap and extending place value knowledge through building, counting and writing two digit numbers and partitioning. Adding and subtracting using equipment and recording work in number sentences. Recapping and developing knowledge of number bonds to 10/20/100.

Counting accurately in in 2s, 5s and 10s and using these skills to solve problems as well as an introduction to multiplication creating equal groups and making arrays.

Name some common 2-D and 3-D shapes and describe some of their properties,

Science

Describe how animals change as they grow and their needs for survival. Discuss animal offspring, including humans, and their adults.

Understanding the importance of staying healthy through exercise, balanced eating and good hygiene including hand washing and teeth care.

Working scientifically using skills such as questioning, observations, classifying, using simple equipment and performing simple tests.

Topic (History and Geography)

Developing historical enquiry and chronological understanding- Show an awareness of the past and the passing of time, describe what happened in Great Fire of London through people and events studied within a chronological framework.

PSHE

Exploring the meaning and actions of our school Christian values and how they can help us in our new class to settle, feel safe, set goals, understand class expectations, work together and contribute to learning as well as keeping safe online, explore positive family relationships and friendships and being part of a community.

Linking to DT and PE, exploring how to keep healthy in our body and our mind. Identify what we need to do to stay healthy

Art /DT

Creating of a colour wheel of primary and secondary colours. Investigating shades and tints.

Appreciate the work of Rita Greer who has painted several pictures of the Great Fire of London

Sculpture Clay Poppies (links to Y2 Science - malleable materials)

DT - making harvest bread and concertina Christmas cards.

Music

Listening to music, including a weekly listening focus.
Playing untuned instruments and performing.
Exploring singing and using their voice confidently to sing simple songs from memory.

Exploring dynamics & Tempo and music can teach us about the past.

Computing

Online-Safety - revisiting and developing how to stay safe online as well as using technology safely and respectfully.

Using different tools and apps as well as data handling including how to use technology to collect information.

PE - Forest School, Gymnastics and Yoga

Gymnastics - exploring movement, actions and ideas with increasing control and coordination moving on and off the equipment, linking their movements to develop a sequence that they can repeat. To have opportunities to observe others and give positive feedback.




Zones of Regulation

Reading

Please try to hear your child read as often as possible - little and often is the best way.

Even if they are fluent readers, they still need to discuss what they have read to aid comprehension and read with expression.

Skills such a navigating non-fiction books are more key skills that year 2 need such as finding and explaining the contents page, sub-headings etc.

Mini Homework projects will be given out to be completed during school holidays.

Phonics - our phonics scheme



- In short, it is a scheme that encompasses phonics, reading, writing and spelling.
- NWI is a phonics programme approved by the Government. Research and evidence shows that it is an effective programme that will support all children to make progress. Reading books should be fully decodable by the child.
- The RWI book will be covered at school at least three times before they are then sent home electronically mid-week. I will also be sending home 'Book Bag Book' on a Thursday which are linked to the sounds and vocabulary they are learning.
- Further information on how we teach reading can be found on the curriculum drop down menu on our website.
- Home support for your child is much appreciated as a home/school team.

Assessment



- Children are assessed and tracked continually throughout the year just as they have been all the way through their time at Puttenham so far.
- SATs are no longer taking place across the country.
- At the end of KS1 children are assessed against criteria where they have either met age related expectations (expected), have not yet met age related expectations (working towards) or have surpassed age related expectations (greater depth).

Puttenham Speaking and Listening award (PSL)

- Combines all of Speaking and Listening targets for KS1.
- This gives the children the opportunity to show case a topic of their choice, recite a poem, read sections from books that they love.
- It helps with their presenting skills and expression which is all part of their literacy learning.
- We will focus more on PSL towards the end of the spring term. We will practise these skills informally throughout the year in class in and show and tell etc.
- Presentations are at the end of the year.
