

EYFS - Expressive arts and design

The development of children's artistic and cultural awareness supports their imagination and creativity. It is important that children have regular opportunities to engage with the arts, enabling them to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials. The quality and variety of what children see, hear and participate in is crucial for developing their understanding, self-expression, vocabulary and ability to communicate through the arts. The frequency, repetition and depth of their experiences are fundamental to their progress in interpreting and appreciating what they hear, respond to and observe.

Creating with Materials: children explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings. They create collaboratively, sharing ideas, resources and skills. Being imaginative and expressive: children explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in a group. They invent and adapt narratives and stories with their peers and their teachers.

At Puttenham School, children are given the opportunity to explore different media in our free flow art area. They are encouraged to use what they know to apply different techniques they have been taught in imaginative ways. As well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role-play, and design and technology.
