Early Years

- ▶ Complete a simple program on a computer.
- ▶ Use ICT to interact with age-appropriate computer software.
- ▶ Early learning goal: children recognise that a range of technology is used in places such as homes and schools. they select and use technology for particular purposes.

Key Stage 1

- ▶ Understand what algorithms are; how they are implemented as programs on digital devices; and that programs execute by following precise and unambiguous instructions
- ▶ Create and debug simple programs
- ▶ Use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs
- ▶ Use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content
- ▶ Recognise common uses of information technology beyond school
- ▶ Use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies.

You can support your child at home by...

Keeping Technology Public at Home

- ▶ Keep tablets/laptops/computers in a public part of the home where everyone is able to see what is being accessed.
- ▶ Sit beside your child when they are using a device



Have Family Rules

Computer addiction at an early age is a problem.

Ground rules need to be set in a household and then they need to be stuck to.

Limit screen time.

Train them to tell you if there is something they are unsure about.



Accountability

Your children should be accountable for the type of person that they are online.

They shouldn't be posting anything or saying anything they would not be happy with you seeing.
